

This is in recognition of her unique pedigree (even though her launch date would normally exclude her,) along with the fact that it is believed she's the only one of Alan Payne's 'Sylph' design still afloat...

I've now been advised by David that our application was **successful** and she'll soon appear on their register.



Membership Fees

I'm sure you will all appreciate that maintaining a yacht in the water in Sydney is not like keeping a steam truck at a Naval base in Victoria...

There are a number of ongoing costs which must be met, such as insurance, registration, mooring, as well as essential maintenance costs, like (the annual) slipping, anti-fouling and painting, as well as just the normal repair and maintenance that, like any other operational vessel, we encounter on a week to week basis.

We strive to break even through the modest donations of guests that join us for outings on Sydney Harbour, but these contributions alone won't maintain the yacht.

At our first AGM it was unanimously agreed that we should levy a small Membership Fee of \$50.00 per year which would go directly towards the yacht's maintenance and upkeep.

It's our intention to keep the yacht in prime condition by slipping her once a year, refurbishing her anti-fouling and zinc protectors. The best time to do this has been determined to be mid to late September, and to that end, it's been decided that our Membership fees should be paid by the 15th September each year.
